Jo Healey is a journalist from the United Kingdom. Formerly a BBC TV journalist, she has worked to identify the best ways to sensitively interview individuals who are vulnerable or affected by trauma, such as victims, survivors, witnesses, and bereaved family members of incidents or disasters. With a deep understanding of trauma, she developed a training program that explores collaborative methods to fulfill journalistic responsibilities while safeguarding both the interviewee and the reporter. This training was shaped through conversations with those who had been interviewed and with experts in the field. Her book, Trauma Reporting: A Journalist's Guide to Covering Sensitive Stories (currently being translated into Japanese), offers numerous practical recommendations.

She has shared her insights through lectures at Princeton University and Oxford University and has trained Ukrainian journalists in trauma-informed reporting. Additionally, she collaborates with NGOs and human rights advocates worldwide. Healey offers guidance on essential practices for responsible journalism, emphasizing the importance of self-care and the key principle.
